Frequently Asked Questions

- What is the difference in the High Point REPORT and WHOA's High Points?

The programs are very similar in the points awarded. The High Point REPORT counts all the results that we receive here at the Walking Horse Report, regardless of HIO affiliation. We only have one triple point show, the Celebration. Shows with a panel of judges are double point shows and shows with only one judge are single point shows.

WHOA Highpoints counts the results from HIOs determined by the WHOA board. In 2007 WHOA has invited all HIOs to have their points counted. WHOA also counts the Celebration as triple points, but they also count the two International horse shows as triple point shows as well.

- How do I know which classes count in each category?

When you go to the High Point REPORT or WHOA Highpoints, you can select CATEGORY DEFINITIONS to see a list of the classes that have been counted in that category.

- My horse doesn't have a class he won listed. What can I do?

- Why are some of the horses' names in the results in red?

What I can learn...

- Leaders of the High Point REPORT, the Report's comprehensive high point program.
- Leaders in WHOA's High Point competition with a soon-to-be introduced new Quest division – leaders in four key divisions of multiple categories.
- The top winning trainers in the Riders' Cup and the horses leading each of the Riders' Cup categories.
- Leading sires in the breed and how their offspring are performing in the show ring.

Where do I start?

In the left hand column, choose the point program you'd like to review: High Point REPORT, WHOA High Points, Riders' Cup or Stallion REPORT.

Both the High Point REPORT and WHOA High Points program default to the Walking Horse Championship category, but you can select any

category by clicking and holding on the Walking Horse Championship menu and moving up or down to select another category. You will see a list of all the horses that have competed in this category so far in 2007. Each horse will have his total points earned as well as how many classes and horse shows in which he has earned those points.

The Stallion REPORT works very similarly but adds two additional categories – Overall Results, which is the total of all the points in every category, and Emerging Stallion Results, which is the total of all the points in every two-year-old, three-year-old and four-year-old category.

WHOA's Highpoints will also have some summary categories coming soon. The new QUEST program will summarize the Youth Flat Shod categories, the Youth Performances categories, the Amateur Flat Shod categories and the Amateur Performance categories.

The Riders' Cup program is a joint program of the Walking Horse Report and the Walking Horse Trainers' Association whereby trainers compete for monies collected from additional entry fees and sponsorships. In each year of the program so far, the program has paid out over \$60,000 to the top 25 trainers. When you select Riders' Cup in the left hand column, it will show the overall results. You can also choose to see which horses are winning in the individual categories by clicking on Overall Standings and moving down the list to any of the five Riders' Cup categories.
