Please note that the FOIA does not require our office to respond to questions posed in FOIA. However, I reached out to the APHIS Human Resources Division (HRD) and the Office Animal Care regarding questions you had regarding Vet licenses.

The Federal Office Personnel Management does not require HRD to import certificates/license in employee's Official Personnel File.

Animal Care provided the following "a federal Veterinary Medical Officer is not required to have a state license to conduct their duties assigned in the federal government. They are exempt from the requirement to hold a state license for each state they work in. The requirements leveraged to obtain a state license are not the same requirements to complete their duties in the federal government especially for enforcing the Horse Protection Act. The VMOs are trained annually face to face for 40 hours prior to horse protection inspections being conducted for the year as well as they receive continuing education of conferences, symposiums, webinars and conference calls throughout the year." I have attached the document from the AAVSB that shows the exemption – pg 13.

Therefore, our office will not be able to provide copies of their veterinary licenses.

There's case law out there that VMOs without current licenses should not (and aren't in some jurisdictions) be allowed to testify in HP cases, just like I couldn't practice law without a current state license.
