- This Show is affiliated with the WHOA. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and adhere to
 the breed rules and regulations. There will be rulebooks in the Show Office for review, if needed.
 Each breed will be governed by their rules, except when WHOA address that rule, then WHOA rules
 will supersede the breed rules.
- Whoa Amateur card is required for non-professional adults riding in an Amateur Class, except in All Day classes. If you do not have a card, one can be purchased from the Secretary's booth. A card for the show is \$20.00. A card for the season is \$60.00. A youth exhibitor is an individual who, on January 1st of the show year has not yet reached his/her 18th birthday.
- 3. No communications devices are allowed in any class.
- 4. A Novice rider for the TWH is a rider who has not won three first place ribbons in any WHOA Show. A Novice horse is a horse that has not won three first place ribbons in any Whoa Show
- A copy of a current negative Coggins MUST accompany pre-entries or pre-entries will not be accepted. A copy of current negative Coggins <u>MUST</u> be left in the show office. The Exhibitor is responsible for providing the copy.
- 6. Once a session has started, there will be NO refund for a scratched class in that session
- 7. This show is for SOUND HORSES ONLY! Any lame or sored horses will be disqualified from competition and could be asked to leave the grounds, no questions asked, and forfeit all fees. All breeds of horses will be checked by the DQP before each class and at least the first place horse will be checked immediately following the class.
- I accordance with WHOA rules TW horses are prohibited from wearing hoof bands.

Class Descriptions: Tennessee Walking Horse Division

<u>Lite Shod Horse</u> – this horse should perform the true walking horse gaits in a relaxed fashion with an alert and willing attitude. The Lite-Shod Horse should display pleasure qualities necessary for road and trail riding, such as good manners, responsiveness and manageability on a light rein. The Lite-Shod horse must stand quietly and back readily on command. Animation counts. Maximum shoe for this division is 1' $\times 1/2$ ' Exhibitors should enter the ring at a flat walk, not a dog walk

<u>Trail Pleasure Horse</u> – this horse should perform the true walking horse gaits with effortlessness geared toward encouraging stamina and longevity on the trails. Animation and action are not desired in a trail pleasure horse and it is not desired for this horse to exhibit driving rear legs with a long over stride. This horse must be extremely well mannered, responsive and quiet; this horse must be manageable on a light rein and must back readily on command. Animation is not required; the judge wants to see a true pleasure horse. **Maximum shoe for this division is 3/4" wide x 3/8" thick Exhibitors should enter the ring at a flat walk, not a dog walk**

<u>Classic park pleasure</u> – this horse should display brilliance and show presence while performing the true walking horse gaits; form is not to be sacrificed for speed. The horse is to be well mannered and manageable on a light rein. The horse should be well balanced, both front and rear; this horse must back readily. **Maximum shoe for this division is 1** ½" wide x ½" thick. Exhibitor should enter the ring at a flat walk, not a dog walk

Racking Horse Division

<u>Trail Pleasure Racking</u> – this horse should perform the true racking gaits with effortlessness geared toward encouraging stamina and longevity on the trails. This horse must be extremely well mannered, responsive and quiet; this horse must be manageable on a light rein and must back readily on command. Animation is not required, the judge wants to see a true pleasure horse; the horse does not need to be wearing the bridle. **Maximum shoe for this division is ¾" wide x 3/8" thick. Exhibitors should enter the ring at a trail rack**

<u>Speed Racking</u> – this is the speed racking horse and it should display brilliance and show presence while performing the true racking horse gaits; form is not to be sacrificed for speed. The horse is to be well mannered and manageable on a light rein. The horse should be well balanced, both front and rear; this horse must back readily. **Maximum shoe for this division is** 1 ½" wide x ½" thick. Exhibitor should enter the ring at a slow rack.

Country Pleasure Division

Country Pleasure – this is the open gaited breed horse; the horse should display a walk and a smooth, easy, comfortable intermediate gait with excessive speed to be penalized. This horse must be extremely well mannered, responsive and quiet; this horse must be manageable on a light rein and must back readily on command. Horses shown Western may use 2 hands.

Animation is not required, the judge wants to see a true pleasure horse. Maximum shoe for this division is ³/₄" wide x 3/8" thick. Exhibitors should enter the ring at a Pleasure Gait

All Day Pleasure

All Day Pleasure – this is the open gaited breed horse; the horse should display a walk and a smooth, easy, comfortable intermediate gait with excessive speed to be penalized. This horse must be extremely well mannered, responsive and quiet; this horse must be manageable on a light rein and must back readily on command. Horses shown Western may use 2 hands Animation is not required, the judge wants to see a true pleasure horse. Maximum shoe for this division is 1 ½" wide x 1/2" thick. Exhibitors should enter the ring at a Pleasure Gait Professional Trainers are prohibited from showing in this division

Spotted Saddle Horse Division

<u>SSH</u> – maybe shown in either English or Western tack and attire, but not a combination of both. Tack and attire will be determined by the class title. <u>Show walk</u>: a saddle gait with a smooth backend. It can be a flat walk or a slow rack, but it is not a dog walk or a trail walk .<u>Show gait</u>: this gait should have an increase in speed from the show walk; examples would be the running walk or fast rack.

Class 55 – To qualify you must enter and be judged in two classes.
