Shoeing Rules	
Lite Shod – 1" wide x 1/2" thick with 1 1/2" turnback	All Day Pleasure – 3/8" x 3/4" keg shoe; horse should be gaited, but does not have to be registered
Trail Pleasure – 3/4" wide x 3/8" thick with 1 1/2" turnback	Park Pleasure – 1 1/2" wide x 1/2" thick with 1 5/8" turnback
Country Pleasure – 3/4" wide x 3/8" thick keg shoe	any steel allowed
Flat Shod -- open to any approved flat shod shoe size	Racking Trail Pleasure – any size shoe up to lite shod
Racking Country Pleasure – any size shoe up to plantation	
Hoof bands and tungsten shoes are prohibited at WHOA shows	Toe length limited to 5" Only clear hoof polish is allowed
Horses showing in the Park Pleasure, Lite Shod, Trail Pleasure, Country Pleasure or All Day Pleasure divisions may not show in a different division at the same show; although they may show in the versatility classes and/or classes designated as "Flat Shod."
